Spider monkeys are 'Acrobats of the Forest' because they are excellent climbers and like to swing from the branches with their tail



Spider monkeys have evolved to have no thumb so they can swing hand over hand underneath tree branches, a form of locomotion called 'brachiation'.

Spider monkeys are frugivores. Undigested seeds remain in their poo which is scattered across the forest, helping the forest to grow. This is why spider monkeys are known as 'seed dispersers'.



Spider monkeys use a social system called 'Fission-fusions'. They sleep in a big group at night time but split into smaller groups in the day to socialize with different monkeys and forage for fruit
